BANKING: First Southern has requested our minutes reflect motions allowing online transfers to our line of credit, along with online viewing of our loan account. We will be asking for these motions to be accepted.

VEHICLES AND EQUIPMENT: We were delayed a month in getting updates on this item to the Board. Our new mechanic, Jackie Deese, has excellent diagnostic skills and he was asked to go thru all our vehicles and equipment to ensure that we had the most up to date and accurate information. RT. 98 PROJECT: The Invitation to Bid was in last Sundays paper and the Bid Opening has been set for Thursday, April 2nd, 2:00 p.m., District Office.

DUKE ENERGY: We have received a revised estimate for installing LED streetlights that we can discuss during our budget process. The original bid was almost a \$6,000 per month increase; the attached proposal is less than \$1,000 per month.

WATER DISTRIBUTION CERTIFICATION: Both Kyle and Matt have qualified for the Distribution Systems 3 examination and will be taking their tests soon.

CAREER SOURCE TRAINING: A \$900 scholarship has been secured for Cindy to attend the 5G Essential Power Skills Certification course at South Florida State College.
