<u>COMMUNITY CENTER DEPOSITS:</u> It has come to my attention that too many cancellations are occurring that lose money for the District and prevent people from reserving an event. Staff is recommending that a deposit NOT be returned unless the reservation is cancelled <u>two weeks</u> prior to the event. This would apply to weekend events, Friday through Sunday, and be effective immediately. The change to the rental agreement will require a deposit at the time of the reservation as well.
