When she first arrived in Spring Lake in the 1970's no one but a true dreamer could envision what would take place in the coming years. Lollie saw and experienced all of it. Starting out as an Associate of Spring Lake Realty, and then becoming its owner, Lollie personified the real estate broker of that time. Whether it was the sale of land, purchase of a house, a rental, or just showing people the area, Lollie was the Queen Bee!!!

Many people knew that Lollie kept everything that was ever written in the newspapers, pamphlets developed by builders, legal notices, pictures, newsletters, and community papers. She actually had the full history of Spring Lake in her file cabinets, bookshelves, and desk drawers. Some of the maps she had on her walls went so far back that the only homes you could see were the ones in Village I. It was a treasure to behold.

Lollie, seen here in a 1975 picture, passed away last year. All of her collections have found a home at the Spring Lake Improvement District Office. What a pleasant surprise it was to have multiple boxes brought to the office for our care and preservation. It is our intention to scan every item Lollie collected, organize them, and put them all on our website. #### Useful information and data for our residents

- BEWARE: Some of our residents are being approached by Water Filter Companies using scare tactics about our District Water Supply. Some of these filters are upwards of \$5,000. There are also companies trying to sell water line insurance. District water meets all State and Federal Guidelines; if you are approached by one of these companies and have questions, do not hesitate to contact our Water Department.

- Since the last issue of The Breeze there have been three incidences of tampering with water meters. This is an illegal act and will result in a \$100 fine plus the cost of damaged items. You must contact the District Office for water to be turned on or off. This is not a negotiated regulation.....it is the law!!

# Improved Drainage





Several residents on Coral Ridge wanted to improve the drainage in front of their homes and asked the District for assistance. After securing a permit from Highlands County a survey team from the County established the necessary grade and the pipes were installed and back filled by the District. The residents were responsible for the cost of the drainage pipes as well as the sod that had to be replaced. There are a number of homes where standing water is often a problem at the end of their lot, near the street. The District Board of Supervisors, along with the District Engineer, will be developing a Resolution that fully outlines the process residents can go thru to correct localized flooding and what the District may be able to do to assist.

## Water Control Projects

Drainage Superintendent Randy Nelson is shown working on a water control maintenance project using District equipment. As a result of Randy being well versed in the operation of heavy equipment the District is saving tens of thousands of dollars for its residents by doing much of the drainage maintenance work "in house" rather than contracting the work out. 



## District Engineer's Update

District Engineer Gene Schriner attended the December 12th Board meeting and updated the Board and staff on the status of our water control plan and the United States Department of Agriculture (USDA) initiative. Gene is President of Craig A. Smith & Associates and his offices are located in Boca Raton. Gene has been the District Engineer for Spring Lake since 2006 and has overseen a number of important projects and activities vital to our District. It is mandated by the State of Florida that all Special Districts contract with a certified engineer who will manage any and all engineering issues and reports will be submitted to the local Board of Supervisors and the District Manager. Spring Lake has been very fortunate to have an engineer who does whatever he can to cut costs for services

and allow District staff to assist on projects and reports that would normally require other paid consultants; this saves our District a lot of tax dollars. Anyone wishing to review the water control plan; preliminary engineering report; conceptual permit; and other engineering projects can do so in our public records room at the District Office at no cost, or copies can be provided per public records price lists.
